Adult Mega Quad Clinic- September 3-6, Hurdle Mills NC

For Players/ Umpires/Coaches

The APA Player Development Committee is listening! We are now offering a clinic for Mid Level Adults Players, as well an intensive Umpire Clinic, and a Coaching Clinic! The success of this clinic will prove a viable format for future clinics in all zones! Please support it!

To qualify for the Player portion of this APA Player Development Program Event, the player must be 18 years of age or older as of August 1, 2010.

Requirements: This clinic's goal is to enable the participants to help spread knowledge to others and help grow polocrosse. Players and assistant coaches will learn drills, techniques, tactics, strategy, riding and teaching. Umpire participants will learn rules and techniques on how to be a good umpire. All participants selected to this program event are encouraged to conduct a clinic for their club or a requesting club upon their return. This is a Player Development Program (PDP) sponsored event-- all proceeds will benefit the PDP for future events.

Format: Each player will be assigned to a Head Coach and Team. All efforts will be made to have the teams and sections within teams as equal as possible. Each team will play a 6 chukka match vs the other two teams. Umpire clinic participants will ump matches.

Players: The PDP will select 21 applicants. This clinic is more about spreading knowledge. The ability to help grow their respective clubs and polocrosse in general will be major determining factors in player selection. Preference will be given to players playing consistently at a B or C grade level.

Coaches: David Brooks, Greg Russell and Ryan Murphy will be the head coaches. Anyone interested in participating in the clinic as coaching auditor will be an assistant coach with these coaches.

Umpires: Chief Umpire Amy Keith will be conducting the umpire clinic. She will be here to teach evaluate and test umpires.

2010 APA Nationals - Harvest Farm, Alabama • October 9 -11

Setting a New Standard in Polocrosse USA Style!

The plans for the 2010 APA National Tournament continue to move forward. Tournament Organizer John Jameson has put together a top notch team of individuals who are working hard to make this the tournament one you won't want to miss! The goal this year is to make this tournament the standard for all nationals going forward.

Our hosts, Barb and Tim Fisk and the Tennessee Valley Polocrosse Club are turning Harvest Farm into a premier polocrosse facility complete with 3 top quality fields- one under professional field lights - plenty of room for camping and penning- large indoor facilities for dinner and social gatherings, sponsors and vendors booths, and a friendly at-home atmosphere for all!

We are acquiring sponsors for the event including equine equipment manufacturers and polocrosse equipment suppliers. With a three day event, time will be set aside for horse and equipment exhibitions so that all participants have the opportunity to enjoy the extra activities!

With membership numbers up this year, the goal is also to have A through D grades as well as Junior divisions and, if there is enough interest, a Masters divisions. Your zone reps will be polling clubs to see how many players are planning to come and how we can fill out these divisions accordingly.

Concern for cost/expenses for individual players as well as the APA organization continues to be a primary concern for the National's Committee. To help offset the expenses and allow this event to be a quality function with reasonable fees, the National's Committee has come up with a plan that will benefit every APA member that attends Nationals as well as help to promote polocrosse. The basic concept is that players will solicit their local businesses (feed store, tack store, fence supplier, vet., barn builder, farrier, chiropractor, etc...) and get a sponsorship donation that will go towards their registration and horse fees. Players will collect a business card from the business and they will then submit the card to the APA for publication on our website and the nationals program. The business will get a little advertisement and also help support players that support their business. The cost of a business card sponsor will be \$40 per business card.

It is projected that the entry costs for senior players will be \$160 plus a \$40 horse fee for a total of \$200 per senior player. The horse fee is a flat fee whether a player brings one horse or more. Players are encouraged to bring backup horses and all teams are required to bring umpire horses. If a senior player obtains 5 business card sponsors (5 cards x \$40.00 = \$200) their entry and horse fees will be covered in whole.

For junior players the projected entry fee is \$120 with no horse fee. If a junior player collects 3 business card sponsors then their entry fees will be covered.

If players are willing to do the leg work and hustle business card sponsors it is essentially a free ride to participate in our national tournament! Also new this year players will be required to register and pay for nationals online at the APA website. Players will also be required to submit their Coggins documentation at the time of registration. More to come on that!

So mark your calendars... keep checking up for new information to come... and talk it up! This is your APA Nationals- lets make it the best one yet!

To Harvest Farm, 850 Harvest Road, Harvest AL 35749
When coming south from Tennessee/Kentucky: Take exit 1 off of I-65. Turn left at end of exit ramp on to Hwy 31. Go straight 14.3 miles (Hwy 31 turns into Hwy 53 in Ardmore-don't turn off) and turn right onto Harvest Road (9th flashing yellow light once you get out of the little town of Ardmore). Go 1 mile on Harvest road and turn left into long gravel drive to reach the barn.

Coming from I-565 or Madison on Wall-Triana Hwy/Rd: Go North on Wall Triana Hwy/Rd towards Madison. Go through Madison and go an additional 7.5 miles past the intersection with Hwy 72 (Hardees on left/a bank across/Shell gas station across/McDonalds on right are landmarks on corners of this intersection). After going the 7.5 miles past this intersection, turn right onto Harvest Road. Go 4/10 mile to driveway to property on right. Barn will be ahead.
